Rudy Project - 10th April



On the warmest and sunniest day of the year so far North Hampshire Road club promoted the latest round of Cycling Time Trials national series sponsored by Rudy Project. Conditions were ideal for the event based in the picturesque village of Preston Candover where 100 riders competed over 17, 25 and 36 mile distances. The disabled riders were first to compete - this was a mixed category including hand bikes and partial sighted tandem riders but it was Paralympic rider Simon Richardson (bigmaggys.com) who came out on top after the necessary time adjustments for the single 17m lap.

Next up were the ladies and veterans (40yrs+) who made up the largest grouping where there was strong local representation including 8 NHRC riders who raced the 25mile

version of the course. Veteran Julian Mclaughlin led in the NHRC contingent in 1:04:16, with Robert Watson next fastest on 1:05:05. The vets event was won by Steve Whitewick (Uttag-Yamaha) in 56:13 to average 26.3mph. Mandy Hibberd was fastest NHRC lady in 1:09:04 with Paralympic double gold medalist Sara Storey winning the ladies category in 58.52.



In the Men's event Andy Hibberd performed well to record 1.31.18 timed over two laps of the main course (36miles). Overall winner Wouter Sybrandy (Sigma Sport - Specialized RT) who has been unbeaten in timetrials so far this season claimed victory with a rapid 1.17.54 (27.3mph) and now leads the series. Despite the good weather, grit on some of the minor roads resulted in a fair number of puncture victims including national champion Michael Hutchinson (In Gear RT) who was a minute up on Sybrandy after the first lap, but suffered a blowout a few miles into the second.
